- 3. Public Comment -
 - It was reported that the next Chowchilla Sub-basin meeting will be at the Chowchilla Water District office on March 7 at 2:00.
 - CARCD is being recommended for the full \$10 million dollars requested to assist landowners in removing dead and dying trees in the High Mortality Areas of the Sierra Nevadas. CARCD will be coordinating with over 35 partners including local RCDs to assist the hard-hit landowners. The planning meeting for this is on Wednesday, February 14 at 12:00 noon – this is a conference call.
 - Sierra Nevada Conservancy is holding a free 2-day Grant Writing Workshop on March 22 and 23. It will be at the North Fork CDC Office at the old Mill Site.
 - CAL FIRE has released information regarding the 2017-2018 California Climate
 Investments (CCI) grant funds. CAL FIRE is administering CCI grant funds to partners
 through grant awards that will help the State reduce greenhouse gas emissions and
 sequester carbon. Up to \$200 million is available through CAL FIRE's Forest Health
 grants and Fire Prevention grants. Up to \$20 million in grant funds is available through
 CAL FIRE's Urban and Community Forestry program. Additionally, CAL FIRE will
 continue to partner with the California Conservation Corps (CCC) by making \$5 million
 available to the CCC's for Forest Health and Fire Prevention activities.

New Business:

- 4. Discussion and Action Financial Report/Warrant Approvals
 Carl J distributed the financial report for February 2018. This was reviewed by the group
 and after discussion, Al S made a motion to approve the Financial Report for this month
 with no changes; Jason R second the motion; all voted; motion is passed unanimously.
- Discussion and Action Meeting Day Change
 This is to be addressed by Supervisor Wheeler and in his absence, will be tabled to the next meeting.
- 6. Discussion IRWM Plan Update Jeannie H received the signed contract from QK for the RWMG files and started working with them on this project, sending any requested information their way. The Grant Writing Specialist from QK attended the RWMG meeting to observe and answer questions. QK is going to proceed as quickly as possible to free this group up for when grant funds are available. QK is requesting any new projects from the RWMG members. Jeannie H was requested to send out the "Call for Projects" with the project form. All are requested to submit any projects they may want to have added to the Plan update. Annalise from QK will be working with the outreach program.

- 7. Discussion Proposition 1 Disadvantaged Community Involvement Funding
 - Mountain Counties Funding Area Lauren from Sierra Institute started contacting key people of each of the IRWM groups in the Mountain County Funding Area. Jeannie H spoke with her and gave her suggestions of other people in this area that work with DACs. The first activity that they are looking to complete is the community mapping exercise, where communities are identified using block groups. They will then go to these identified communities and conduct workshops to assess community capacity and identify water and wastewater needs. Community capacity combined with multiple socioeconomic indicators will be how they identify which of the communities are disadvantaged. Jeannie H is also working with Southern Sierra IRWM and their DAC program.
 - San Joaquin River Funding Area This group has continued to work together and have conference calls to move forward. The draft MOU was given to the SJRFA and then was sent out to the members of the Madera RWMG. The MOU reflects the intentions of the SJRFA RWMGs and stakeholders toward development, implementation, and management of the SJRFA DAC Involvement Grant Program. This MOU does not impose any legal requirements, commitments, or obligations upon its participants. It was stated that cooperation under this MOU is voluntary. Carl J stated that he will make a suggestion that each RWMG in the funding area receive at least 6% (\$168k) of the funding, the remainder of the funding will follow the need. Contra Costa County is the applicant and San Luis Delta Mendota is second applicant.

This group is the last to submit their application and it has been challenging. It was suggested that this group needs to look back at what is eligible under this funding – the program was to improve the challenges of getting the DACs involved with the IRWM program. Projects are important, but not the priority; projects should fall under implementation funds. Outreach, education, socioeconomic studies, needs assessments, and governance are the areas that are scoring the best for the applications and this DAC funding. There is a need to review the lists of eligible tasks. And review how the funding is going to be used in the entire funding area in an equitable manner – no one area should receive the bulk of this funding.

Old Business:

Report – Sustainable Groundwater Management - SGMA
 Between the Madera and the Chowchilla Sub-Basins, there were four grants approved for
 category 1 and category 2. Chowchilla Subbasin is looking at the water budget and doing
 CB2 sim modelling. The next Chowchilla Sub-basin meeting will be at the Chowchilla Water
 District office on March 7 at 2:00 to discuss the water budget.

The Madera Sub-Basin created a little bit different scope of work and it is in draft form until the GSP is written. They are forming the coordination committee and will have a governance in place soon. At the November 21, 2017 County Groundwater Sustainability Agencies Board of Directors meeting, the applicants were appointed to serve a one (1) year term on the Groundwater Advisory Committee. These advisory committees support the county-managed Groundwater Sustainability Agencies only, and there are multiple agencies throughout the county engaged in groundwater management planning. Position for the Director of Water and Natural Resources is still open, the deadline for applications/resumes was on January 31.

10. Report – Grant Updates

• Round I - Implementation Projects

The County Staff is still waiting on the permit from the Department of Fish and Wildlife; they have been contacted weekly to verify if the permit has been approved; DFW had 60 days to respond to this permit request and it is taking all 60 days. This will be a no fee permit for property owners on the waterways to be able to remove the sand in the waterways adjacent to their properties. The land owners will be asked to apply to remove the sand from the sloughs; this work will be the match for the grant. Letters have been sent to the landowners in the project area to create interest for sand removal. Anyone can remove sand (after they receive the permit from the county), but the county needs to be available to inspect the work

There are no funds left for the future removal of Arundo in these areas. Funds are being collected for flood control, but this is not enough to cover all the counties flood control needs. Arundo is part of the flood control issues
