Public comments are being accepted on the draft guidelines for the State Water Board's Groundwater Treatment and Remediation Grant Program. The funding is for projects that prevent or reduce contamination of groundwater that is used for drinking water. There will be three public meetings, beginning on Monday June 24, in Rancho Cordova, to collect comments on the guidelines.
- The California Natural Resources Agency will be accepting project proposals for the Green Infrastructure Grant Program from **May 13, 2019 through June 28, 2019**. Approximately \$18.5 million in awards will be funded by the program. Applicants submitting the most competitive proposals will be invited to participate in the next level of the competitive process, anticipated late Summer/early Fall 2019. The Green Infrastructure Grant Program, funded by Proposition 68, will fund multibenefit green infrastructure projects in or benefitting disadvantaged or severely disadvantaged community.
