



Letter of Intent

- Madera County Flood Control and Water Conservation Agency submitted a Letter of Intent (LOI) to the Central Valley Flood Protection Board (CVFPB) in 2020
- Public Law 84-99 (PL 84-99) provides US Army Corps assistance to repair damages to flood control facilities following a flood emergency
- LOI is first step in regaining eligibility under PL 84-99
- County has been inactive under PL 84-99 since 2015

Approval of LOI by CVFPB

- On July 29, 2022 the CVFPB approved the County's LOI and directed the Executive Director to send the LOI to the Army Corps for review
- Expecting between 3-6 months for full approval
- Once the LOI is reviewed and approved the County regains eligibility under PL 84-99
- This eligibility is contingent upon the preparation of a System Wide Improvement Framework (SWIF)

Preparation of SWIF

- The County has two years once the LOI is approved to develop and submit an adequate SWIF
- County has contract with Wood Rodgers to prepare SWIF
- Annual progress reports due to Army Corps
- County will work with Wood Rodgers to adequately address funding obstacles for Agency
