Items of Interest

- DWR's Sustainable Groundwater Management Office (SGMO) is expanding its Technical Assistance efforts to include a newly formed Data Support Section. DWR is doing this to expand its office to meet both the regulatory and assistance roles identified in SGMA. Much of this data support includes integrating datasets with other state agencies and making it readily accessible to the public. With this expansion, SGMO is now compromised of seven sections, including two GSP Review Sections, a Technical Assistance Section, a Data Support Section, a Modelling Support Section, and two Outreach and Engagement Sections. - The new water year began on October 1st, and DWR has released the latest version of <u>California's Groundwater Conditions</u>, <u>Semi-Annual Update: October 2022</u>. This update is part of a suite of groundwater data, tools, and publications under the umbrella of <u>DWR's California's Groundwater (Bulletin 118</u>) and provides information on statewide groundwater levels, land subsidence, and well infrastructure, including dry well reporting, and summarizes the effects of the current and historical drought periods on California's groundwater conditions.

For the most up-to-date groundwater information, <u>California's Groundwater</u> <u>Live</u> website is updated daily and includes data on groundwater conditions, well infrastructure, reported dry wells, and land subsidence.

- State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) staff developed a <u>SGMA Groundwater Quality Visualization Tool</u> to help GSAs and other interested parties identify groundwater quality issues in their basins. The tool identifies constituents already exceeding water quality criteria in each basin that could be further impacted by groundwater extraction or management activities. The tool uses the same methodology State Water Board staff used when developing comments for DWR on GSPs, available at https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/sgma/gsp-comment-letters.html.

- The US Bureau of Reclamation Small Surface Water and Groundwater Storage Projects Grant is currently accepting applications through December 9th. This program funds planning, design, and construction of small surface water and groundwater storage facilities, which can stretch scarce water supplies and avoid conflicts over water. Please click here for more information.
- The California Natural Resources Agency and the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Forest Service, along with support from Google.org, have developed a new wildfire resilience planning tool. Planscape uses State and federal resilience data to create user-friendly models that will be accessible to land planners. This new tool will enable forest planners to have access to the latest data as they plan landscape-scale projects.

- Urban water use efficiency reports and recommendations developed by DWR have been sent to the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) and have been posted online. The documents provide details on DWR's process for developing recommendations, guidelines, and methodologies for urban water suppliers to use in calculating annual water use objectives. The State Water Board will begin the process of reviewing the recommendations for adopting regulations.
- DWR has extended the application deadline for Prop 68 (SGMA Implementation)) Round 2 to December 16th at 10 am.
