Madera County officials will be holding two Open House-style public engagement events as part of the comprehensive solid waste management study currently underway and invite residents, businesses, community groups, and others to participate in these events. These events will provide an opportunity for community members to learn about and provide feedback on the consultant's preliminary findings prior to finalizing the study.

The solid waste management study, which began at the beginning of the summer, aims to provide an in-depth analysis of current solid waste practices and identify opportunities for improvement. The study incorporates input from the community collected through two engagement opportunities: World Caféstyle events held in May and a community survey circulated online. The County expects the consultant to publish its preliminary findings at least a week before
