Root Creek Water District GSA's actual water measurements reflect a 50–100-foot difference in data when compared to the model, and the GSP recognizes that there is a difference in RCWDGSA. There are 4 sites designated to measure subsidence in the

Madera Subbasin – none of the sites are near the RCWD boundary. RCWD historically shows a subsidence rate of approximately .2 ft/year.

7. Resolution to adopt a revised updated RCWDGSA Groundwater Sustainability Plan –

Director DelaGuerra made a motion to adopt the resolution, seconded by Director Coulthard and the motion carried.

8. Annual Report – Director Coulthard made a motion, seconded by Director Simonian to accept the 2022 Annual Report for the RCWDGSA GSP, subject to edits by the District Engineer, and the motion carried.

Julia and Board of Directors:

The attached Well permit request is for the property identified above. It was received on 6/23/23 for the purpose of agricultural production. Executive Order N-7-22 which adopted on March 28, 2022 and remains in affect, requires permitting agencies to among other things (1) not approve a permit for a new groundwater well that would decrease the likelihood of achieving a sustainability goal for the basin covered by such a plan and (2) Issue a permit for a new groundwater well without first determining that that extraction of groundwater from the well is (a) not likely to interfere with the production and functioning of existing nearby wells and (b) not likely to cause subsidence that would adversely impact or damage nearby infrastructure.

From review of the historical district cropping records it does not appear that the land has been used in recent years for agricultural production. Thus, it appears that this new well will increase the water demand within the Root Creek Water District Groundwater Sustainability Agency (RCWDGSA) over historical periods. It has been the policy to allow for continued use of the land for agricultural production and increased surface water supplies will be developed so as to allow for this development. The landowner pays the melded costs for surface supplies to allow for this continued agricultural production. Thus, the conclusion is the proposed new well will not decrease the likelihood of achieving the sustainability goal for the Root Creek Groundwater Sustainability Plan (RCGSP) nor the basin.

The RCWDGSA does not issue the permit for the construction of the well, however with a 500 foot setback from the next closest adjacent agricultural well it can be estimated that there may be a level impact to the adjacent well of up to 5 foot decline in water level while the new well is operating. Based upon historical records it is not expected nor likely that the proposed well will cause subsidence that would adversely impact nearby infrastructure.




WELL PERMIT ADDENDUM INFORMATION REQUIRED BY SENATE BILL 252 (2017) (WATER CODE SECTION 13807 ET SEQ.)

Subject to the exemptions outlined in Water Code Section 13808.4(b), the County of Madera (County) must request from every applicant (or the applicant's agent) for a permit for a new well located within a critically overdrafted basin (as defined in Water Code Section 13807.5(b)) estimates of the below information to the extent that it can be reasonably known as part the permit application. In addition, pursuant to Water Code Section 13808.2, the County must make all such information provided by the applicant (or the applicant's agent) available to the public and groundwater sustainability agencies located within the basin where the proposed well is located.

MCC 13.52.050(B) Well Standards.

Well Location. All well(s) shall be constructed to prevent the entrance of surface water and contaminated groundwater into the well or into the producing aquifer, and shall be separated a safe distance from potential sources of contamination and pollution. The following minimum horizontal distances shall be maintained for all wells furnishing potable water for human consumption:

*The above separation distances are for wells with adequate annular seals drilled in dry upper consolidated formations that are less permeable than sand. Wells drilled in fractured rock formations need to have much greater separation distances.

Indemnity and Hold Harmless Agreement

Applicant agrees that it has the contracted duty (hereinafter "the duty"), to the fullest extent allowed by law, to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its Board of Supervisors, commissions, officers, employees, agents and assigns (hereinafter the "County") from and against any and all claims, petitions, demands, liability, judgments, awards, interest, attorney fees, costs, expert fees, and expenses arising out of, or in any way connected with, any permit or other approval issued by the County and/or its boards, commissions, or departments, whether in tort, contract, writ of mandamus, or otherwise. Applicant's defense and indemnity obligations under this Agreement shall apply, regardless of intent or fault, to any allegation or claim of liability brought against the County based on any permit or other approval issued by the County. including but not limited to land use and environmental law actions. Applicant's duty shall arise at the first claim, petition, or allegation of liability against the County. Applicant will on request and at its expense, defend any action suit or proceeding arising hereunder. This duty shall not be limited to any claims, petitions, demands, liability, judgments, awards, interest, attorney fees, costs, expert fees, and/or expenses that may arise during the term of this Agreement but shall also apply to all such claims and the like, after the term of this Agreement. In the event that Applicant is required to defend the County in connection with any legal proceeding, the County shall have and retain the right to approve:

a. The counsel to defend County, at a cost not exceeding the prevailing and reasonable rates for counsel practicing environmental and land use law in the State of California or practicing any other area of law that the County determines that the claim or action may reasonably require; and

b. All significant decisions concerning the manner in which the defense is conducted; and

c. Any and all settlements, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.

The County shall have and retains the right to not participate in the defense of a proceeding, except that the County agrees to reasonably cooperate with Applicant in the defense of such proceeding. If County Counsel participates in the defense in any way, whether or not as counsel of record, all County Counsel attorney fees and costs shall be paid by Applicant.
