## Items of Interest (Jacob Roberson)

- The Governor's Office of Planning and Research has published the <u>final</u> <u>guidelines</u> for the 1<sup>st</sup>round of funding under the Regional Resilience Grant Program. The grants are for projects that advance climate resilience and respond to climate risks. A series of workshops is being held to help applicants through the process. The full list of workshops is available on the <u>program's webpage</u>.
- The DWR's innovative Statewide Airborne Electromagnetic (AEM) Survey
  Project recently released AEM data for the entire Central Valley. Over 11,500
  line-miles of AEM data were collected within the Central Valley between
  December 2021 and May 2022 using helicopter-based technology that scans the
  earth's subsurface. Benefits of the Survey Project include:
  - Providing a standardized, statewide dataset that improves the understanding of groundwater aguifer structures and groundwater basin hydrology
  - Helping local GSAs further develop and refine hydrogeologic conceptual models and groundwater models that are required elements in GSPs
  - Helping local agencies determine areas in their basins where additional, more targeted surveys may be beneficial to fill data gaps
  - Helping local agencies determine the best places to locate groundwater recharge projects, and other projects that support long-term groundwater sustainability and water supply resilience
  - Providing this data to local agencies saves them the time and expense needed to gather this data themselves, and they can dedicate those resources instead to local projects and management actions that will help them reach their sustainability goals
- The CAL FIRE Business and Workforce Development Grants is currently accepting applications for the 2023 Q3 review. The deadline to apply is September 30<sup>th</sup>.

The Grant Guidelines are available online and can be found by <u>clicking here</u>. Highlights for the Q3 solicitation include:

- \$5 million available for Biomass Transportation projects
- Up to \$10 million for Business and Workforce projects

- DWR recently released a brochure that provides an overview of the elements in SGMA. The brochure describes benefits of SGMA and includes DWR resources to help with SGMA compliance. The brochure is available in both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>.
- A <u>new flyer</u> from DWR provides the four initial steps for wells owners to take if they think their well has gone dry. The first step provides website information for contacting a certified well professional. The flyer information is part of the <u>Be</u> <u>Well Prepared</u> program that provides information and resources to help deal with

- impacts of climate-driven weather extremes on groundwater supplies and drinking water wells. The flyer is available in <a href="Spanish">Spanish</a> and <a href="Hmong">Hmong</a> as well.
- The California Water Plan team has scheduled two virtual workshops in September to cover three resource management strategies (RMS') that will support the <u>California Water Plan Update 2023</u>. On <u>September 13<sup>th</sup></u>, the workshop will cover the draft Desalination RMS. On <u>September 21<sup>st</sup></u>, the draft Conjunctive Use RMS and the draft Recharge Area RMS will be discussed. The workshops will serve as a venue for interested parties to provide input on the draft content and recommendations.
- DWR has release the <u>Status of 2023 Urban Water Managements Plans</u> (<u>UWMPs</u>). This is a part of a series of reports submitted to the Legislature every five years to summarize the status of the last <u>UWMP</u> submittals. The findings of the report show that most urban water suppliers are becoming more water efficient while demonstrating resiliency to drought and catastrophic events.
