Subbasin Announcements

As the new water year begins, the Delta-Mendota Subbasin continues with groundwater sustainability plan (GSP) implementation, consistent with SGMA requirements, despite the GSPs being deemed "Inadequate" by the California Department of Water Resources (DWR). During the third quarter of 2023, the Subbasin completed mandatory summer water quality recollishing.

Progress on the Delta-Mendota Subbasin Single GSP Approach for SGMA Compliance

Delta-Mendota Subbasin Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs) put policy and technical issues on parallel tracks as they seek approval for a single GSP for the entire 750,000-acre Subbasin. On the policy side, the Coordination Committee agreed to a revised cost allocation to pay a consultant to revise the six previous GSPs into a single GSP for the Subbasin. Under a single GSP, a Coordination Agreement is no longer required. However, GSA representatives want a framework in place for working cooperatively, so a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) will replace the Coordination Agreement once the single GSP is adopted. The MOA will have a stronger focus on GSP implementation.

The Subbasin's Coordination Committee will remain intact. Previously it consisted of eight seats with a total of six votes. Under the MOA, there will be seven seats with each seat having a vote. However, the MOA will

not take effect until the single GSP is adopted by all the GSAs in the Subbasin. That is anticipated to be presented to the GSAs for adoption in July of 2024.

On the technical track, a limited number of Committee members, staff, and consultants are meeting with State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) staff on a monthly basis to discuss achieving "approved" status for the Subbasin's GSP and addressing deficiencies identified by DWR. SGMA legislation requires that once a GSP is determined "inadequate" by DWR, it moves to the jurisdiction of the SWRCB for approval.

SGMA Grant Activities

Activities continue on the SGMA Round 1 Implementation Grant, funded through DWR. The \$7.6 million grant is being administered by Del Puerto Water District on behalf of the Subbasin.

Grant-funded activities are focused on a variety of projects and management actions that will assist local GSAs in complying with the requirements of SGMA. These projects and management actions were prioritized by the local GSAs to help achieve groundwater sustainability across the Subbasin.

Water Level Monitoring

GSAs are in the process of collecting fall water level monitoring data. Data will be submitted to DWR as required by SGMA in the fall.


information. At the moment, we are drafting the Madera County Drought Contingency Plan required by Senate Bill 552.

RECHARGE

Groundwater Recharge Legislation Takes Effect January 1, 2024OCTOBER 23, 2023

Governor Gavin Newsom has signed SB 659 as a means for improving groundwater recharge efforts. The legislation known as the California Water Supply Solutions Act of 2023 was authored by Senator Angelique V. Ashby. It was co-sponsored by the California Association of Winegrape Growers (CAWG). This bill empowers the Newsom Administration and future governors to implement long-term strategies, including regulations and funding, to address the impacts of climate change on the state's water supply.

UPCOMING EVENTS

As a part of DWR's California's Groundwater (Bulletin-118) Basin Characterization Program, DWR implemented the Statewide Airborne Electromagnetic Survey Project and have now collected over 15,000 line-miles of data, covering the extent of 78 groundwater subbasins, including the entire Central Valley. The AEM data have been interpreted for material texture (coarse fraction) and can be used to better understand groundwater recharge pathways and identify potential aquifer recharge locations. Under the Basin Characterization Program, DWR is conducting a series of pilot studies to address SGMA-related groundwater questions and the first pilot study focuses on providing information to support floodplain rehabilitation, groundwater recharge, and domestic well assistance activities.
