## RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO WELL OWNERS IN MADERA COUNTY

Residents of Madera County and the Central Valley who have been affected by the impacts of the drought have immediate resources available to help maintain their access to drinking water.

#### **Know Your Zone**

Madera County has begun utilizing an innovative on-line map service, Genasys Protect, for the public to reference as an additional tool to receive prompt, accurate information during an emergency.

Genasys Protect allows community members to go to their website or smartphone app and enter their address to see if they are impacted by any ongoing incidents, making it anefficient and accurate way to view current conditions.

To efficiently respond when evacuations are issued, it's important for residents to know what zone their address is in. The Madra County Sheriff's Office encourages community members to "Know Your Zone" - Before an emergency strikes.

Madera County will continue to issue MCALERT notifications by text and voice call to alert residents of Advisories, Evacuation Warnings, and Evacuation Orders resulting from wildfires, natural disasters, or other emergencies.

#### **SJVAPCD Raisin Tray Rebate Program**

The San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (SJVAPCD) is accepting applications for the *Non-Combustion Alternatives to Open Burning of Raisin Trays Program (Raisin Tray Rebate Program)*. The Program provides rebates to Valley raisin growers to help support the deployment of non-burning alternatives for the disposition of raisin trays.

#### Requirements:

- Rebates are available for the disposal of raisin trays at local disposal sites through self-hauling or third-party hauling services.
- Rebates are funded based on the number of acres associated with the raisin tray disposal.
- Rebates are available for the 2023 harvest season to assist in the transition to non-burning alternatives. Rebate applications will be accepted through March 31, 2024.
- No portion of the raisin trays can be burned, or disposed of in any type of combustion process, prior to or after submission of the rebate application.
- Waste, other than the raisin trays, cannot be included in the waste hauling services being submitted with the rebate application.
- The vineyard associated with the raisin trays must be located within the S.IVAPCD boundaries
