## FINAL REMINDER: 2023 OPT-IN ENROLLMENT DEADLINE

If you will be planting land in 2024 that has never been irrigated before, you will need to notify the County GSAs by **November 30**, **2023**. We sent out letters with important information on this process <u>only to landowners with never irrigated parcels</u> since this <u>only applies to landowners</u> <u>with never irrigated lands</u>. Approved parcels will be allocated a sustainable yield and come with associated fees and reporting requirements.

#### Preliminary Recharge Estimates In Madera County GSAs

We would like to inform all growers within the Madera County Groundwater Sustainability

Agencies (GSAs) about an important initiative.

We have introduced a Recharge Form aimed at gathering preliminary information on recharge efforts in the County GSAs for the year 2023. This form is crucial for assessing and understanding the ongoing recharge activities in the region. It is imperative that all growers who diverted water in 2023 participate by filling out the form to provide valuable insights into the collective efforts being made.

Once the Madera County Board of Supervisors finalizes the recharge credit policy and potential credits, we will require an official report from each grower, accompanied by the necessary documentation. Your cooperation in this matter is highly appreciated, as it plays a pivotal role in the sustainable management of groundwater resources in our community.

If you conducted recharge in 2023 with Executive Order water or Purchased Water, please complete the Recharge Form by **November 23, 2023.** 

#### **MEASUREMENT**

You will soon be receiving a letter outlining the Measurement Method options for the year 2024. This letter provides you with the opportunity to switch your current measurement method. This process solely pertains to modifying your measurement method. Once you make a selection, you won't be able to alter your choice for the year 2024 until the end of that year. #### **SJVAPCD Raisin Tray Rebate Program**

The San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (SJVAPCD) is accepting applications for the Non-Combustion Alternatives to Open Burning of Raisin Trays Program (Raisin Tray Rebate Program). The Program provides rebates to Valley raisin growers to help support the deployment of non-burning alternatives for the disposition of raisin trays.

#### Requirements:

- Rebates are available for the disposal of raisin trays at local disposal sites through selfhauling or third-party hauling services.
- Rebates are funded based on the number of acres associated with the raisin tray disposal.
- Rebates are available for the 2023 harvest season to assist in the transition to nonburning alternatives. Rebate applications will be accepted through March 31, 2024.
- No portion of the raisin trays can be burned, or disposed of in any type of combustion process, prior to or after submission of the rebate application.
- Waste, other than the raisin trays, cannot be included in the waste hauling services being submitted with the rebate application.
- The vineyard associated with the raisin trays must be located within the SJVAPCD boundaries.
