MADERA SUBBASIN - DOMESTIC WELL MITIGATION FEE

Yesterday on July 15, 2025, the Board of Directors for the Madera County GSA approved a fee of \$59/enrolled acre to fund part of a Domestic Well Mitigation Program in the Madera Subbasin (Resolution 2025-067). Program details will be shared as they evolve for public comment.

MEASUREMENT

The satellite measurement contracts with Hydrosat (previously called Irriwatch) and Land IQ are up at the end of the 2025 year. Spring 2025 Semi-Annual Groundwater Conditions Update

DWR recently released the Spring 2025 Semi-Annual Groundwater Conditions

Update. Made up of groundwater data gathered over the past year from various

DWR tools and annual reports from local GSAs, the Update includes
information on statewide groundwater levels, groundwater storage, recharge,
land subsidence, well infrastructure and the status of California's groundwater
conditions. The Update also summarizes groundwater conditions in the first five
years of SGMA implementation since GSAs submitted their initial GSPs.
